Thus we become, more or less consciously, supporters of the Grand Inquisitor who, as Ivan Karamazov tells us, opposes Christ when he returns to earth to give freedom to an exhausted humanity, so as to protect us from the burden of choice. And he condemns him to death once again, because humanity is not in a position to receive his overly demanding gift: the faculty to choose.

And yet, we biodancers should have received some sort of antidote.

The encounter with the other, listening to them, discovering them, their epiphany, this is all part of the good practices to which we have long dedicated ourselves.
